Why do we call Good Friday??

Good Friday, the unspeakable truth of the cross, is the day we Christians observe and remember the crucifixion of Jesus and His death at Calvary. This Christian holiday is also known as Holy Friday, Great Friday and Holy Friday.

NANGNO KA MIH KA KTIEN EASTER?

Ia ka ktien tynrai jong ka Easter ym lah ban pyntikna. Uwei u riewniam uba kyrteng u Bede, uba im ha ka spah snem kaba phra, uba long ruh u riewshemphang, u la ong ba kane ka ktien ka lah ban mih na ka ktien Anglo-Saxon Eeostre lane Eastre – na kata ka blei Teutonic jong ka pyrem bad ka jinglong seisoh. Ki nongwad bniah kiba dang shen ki lap ba kam don satia kano kano ka jingkdew ia kata ka blei kaba u Bede u ong, kumta kim lah pdiang ia kata ka theory jong u.

Kawei pat ka lah ban long na ka ktien Norse eostur, eastur, lane ostara, kaba mut ka " aiom jong ka jingsan jong ka sngi" ("the season of the growing sun") lane ka "aiom jong ka jingkha pat" ("the season of new birth"). Ka ktien east ruh ka wan na kane kajuh ka tynrai. Ha kaba iadei bad kane, ka ktien easter ka ia snoh bad ka jingkylla ka aiom.

Ka jingbatai ba kham hadien kaba kham long pait-pnat ka wan na ka nongrim Khristan shaphang ka Easter ban ia kaba iadei bad ki jingngeit barim (pagan). Ha ka ktien Latin ba mynshuwa, ia ka taiew Easter la ong hebdomada alba lane ka taiew rong lieh ("white week") katba ka Sunday hadien ka Easter la khot dominica in albis kaba wan na ki sopti lieh jong kito kiba dang pynbaptis thymmai. Ka ktien alba ka dei ka Latin na ka bynta ka rong lieh lane ka step phyrngab. Ki briew kiba kren ia ka ktien Old High German ki sngewthuh bakla ha kaba translate bad ki la pyndonkam da ka plural ia ka step phyrngab (dawn), da ka ktien ostarun, ha ka jaka ka plural jong ka rong lieh. Na ka ostarun ka mih ka ktien German Ostern bad ka Easter ha ka English.

Ha kine ki khyndiat snem, la bun ki briew kiba sngew khohnioh ia ka ktien Easter namar ki ong ba ka mih na kita ki jinglehniam barim(paganism) bad kiba bun ki la pyndonkam noh da ka Resurrection Day ne ka Sngi ka Jingmihpat. Hynrei, haba peit ia ki jingiaid lynti jong ki kyntien, ngi shem ba ka don hi ia ka nongrim ha ki jinglehniam Khristan. Lehse ka ktien Easter kan dang sah hi sa bun tylli ki snem,namar lada ngi wad ia kane ka ktien ha ka internet, ngin shem beit ba ka dei shaphang ka jingmihpat U Trai Jisu. Kumta ngin ym sngew pher ia kane ka kyntien, namar baroh shi tyllup ka pyrthei ki ia tip ia ka Easter kum ka sngi ba ngi rakhe bad kynmaw burom ia ka jingmihpat U Trai jong ngi. Lehse, ngin ym pynbun kam ha kaba iatai nia ia ka kyntien, hynrei ngin peit beit ia ka jingmut kaba shisha ha kaba ngi pdiang bad ithuh ia U Trai jong ngi uba la shah iap halor ka diengphna bad uba la mihpat ban im sha ki bymjukut. Ka jingkyrmen jong ngi ka shong ha kane, "ba da ka kyrteng jong U uno uno baroh uba ngeit ha U, un ioh kaba map ki pop"(Ki Kam.10:43). Ai ba ka jingiap bad jingmihpat U Jisu Khrist kan thaw thymmai iangi bad ka jingim jong ngi kan shai kum ka step ba phyrnai.

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
